

# Continuity of medicines for people in and released from prison




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## About the Project

- Different ways to access your prescriptions
- Such as:
- 1. Emergency medications urgent, out of hours, NHS 111
- 2. Repeat medications Including mobile apps NHS subscription
- 3. Community pharmacy access options and how easy it is
- 4. GP practice medication reviews
- Information pack for staff and patients regarding medicines continuity post release – includes different services and access to different medicines

# Aim of the Project





- It is important that staff employed to work on the Pre-release regime demonstrate an interest in Medicine continuity and are committed to promote the ethos and aims of this work to help prisoners progress towards an accessible medicines post release.
- Older prisoners who are released after a long sentence and end up living alone may be unaccustomed to the modern world and how to access medicines, especially online.
- Younger prisoners may go back to live with their families and may be savvy with smart phones and online, but they still need help with how to order medications, etc.
- One concern is that prisoners who fail to get to grips with the process may resort to other ways of getting their medications, which could lead to them offending again.

#### Videos

We aim to film all four videos in one day in a London green screen studio. The actors will be a mix of gender, age, and ethnicity.

• Each video will feature a presenter (played by an actor). The presenter takes the viewer on a journey that demonstrates each stage of how to obtain their medication.
