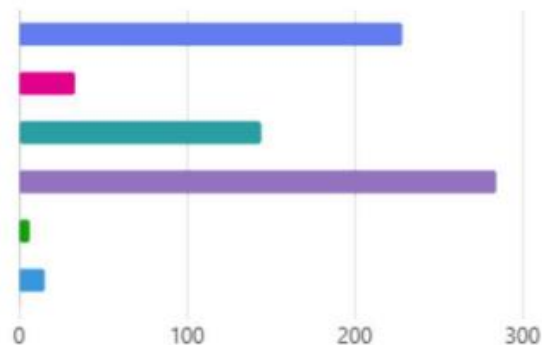

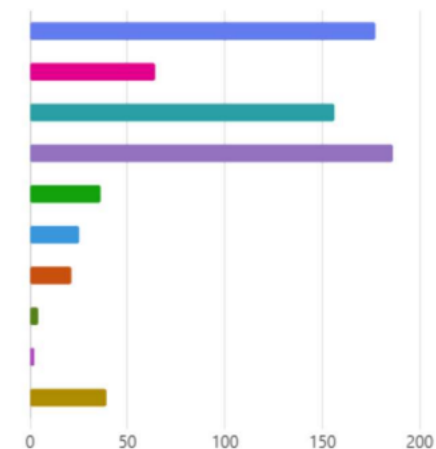
1. What is your profession?

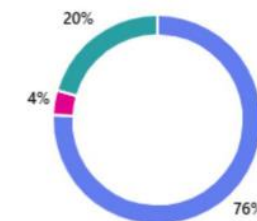
2. Where do you predominantly work?
