Results from the survey of MSOs

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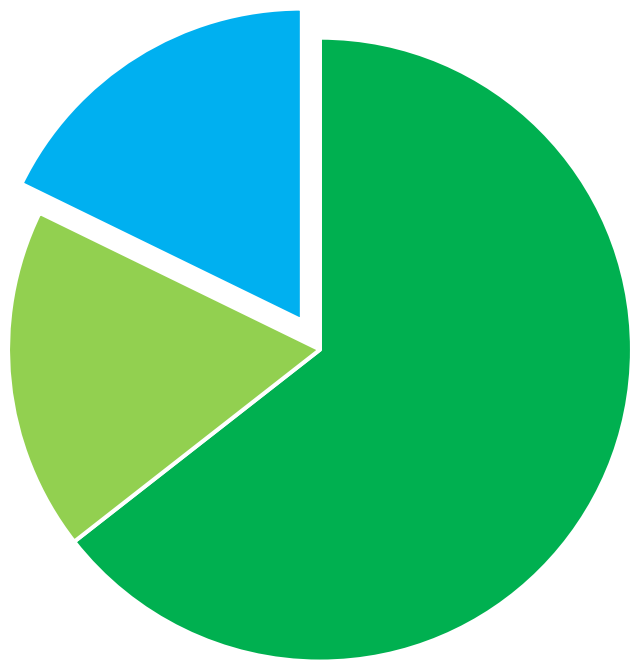
The first stop for professional medicines advice

# Survey

- Developed MS forms survey of 18 questions
- Emailed all secondary care MSOs on register
- Open for 26 days
- Average time to complete 14 minutes
  
- 45 organisations
  - Average of 59.3 hours of time dedicated to medication safety
    - Range 4 to 237.5

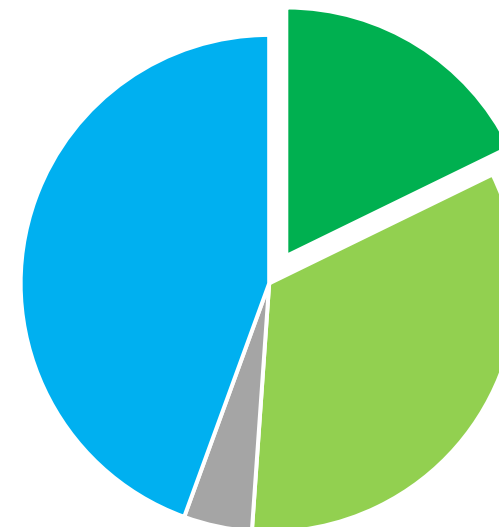


# Are medicines included in PSIRP?

■ Yes fully ■ Somewhat ■ Not sure ■ No

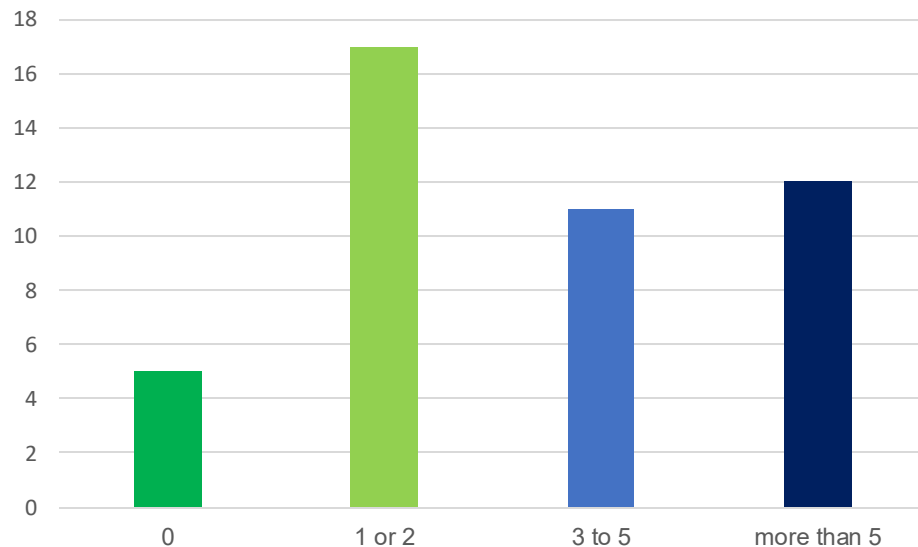
## Do you feel you have had adequate training in using the learning response tools?

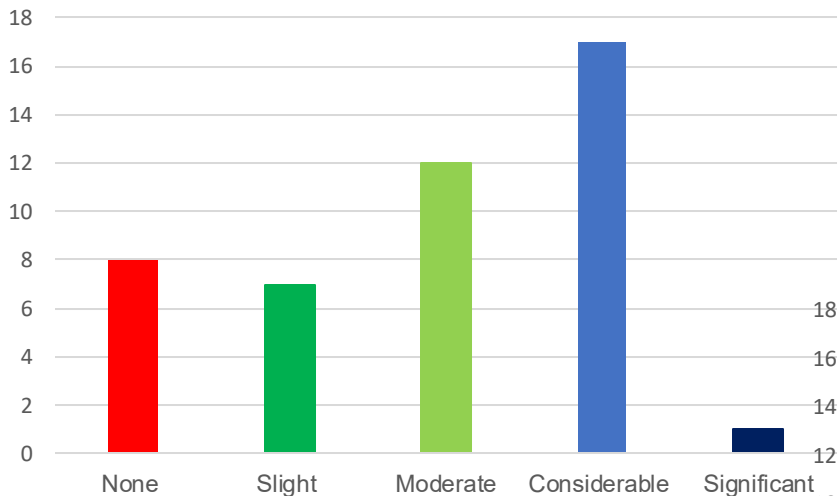

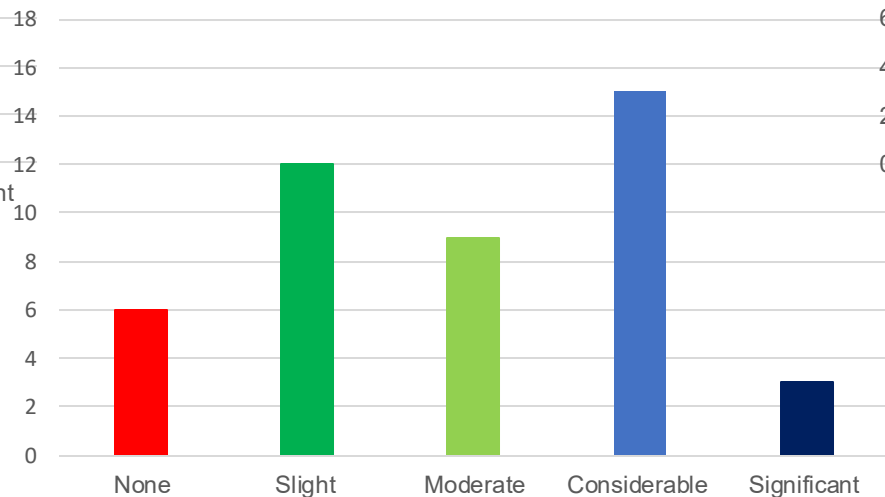

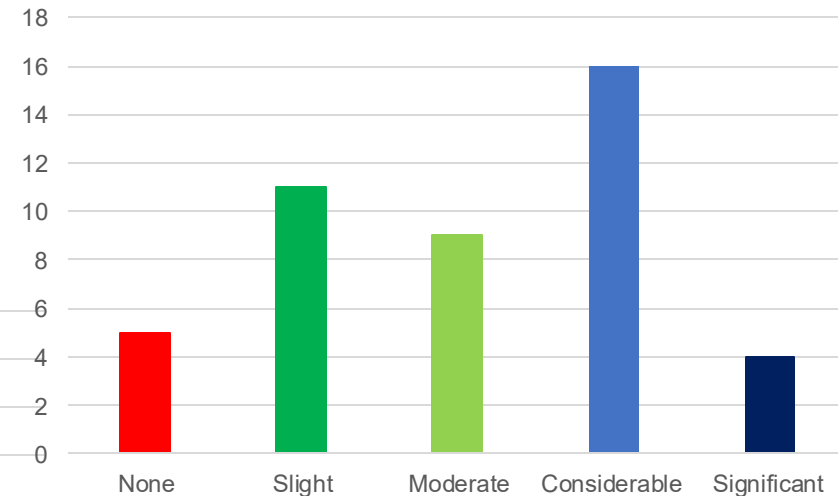
